- ♦ Women of the ELCA is the women's ministry organization and a churchwide program unit of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. An estimated 500,000 women of all ages in more than 7,500 congregations and special units participate in Women of the ELCA's local, churchwide, and global ministries of faith development, service, advocacy, and leadership in church and society.
- ♦ The VSWO works to assist all units in Virginia to fulfill the purpose of the Women of the ELCA as defined in our purpose statement. This is accomplished by providing programs at our yearly convention and also retreats, publishing quarterly newsletters, and nurturing leadership development.
- The unit is the "member" of Women of the ELCA; individual women are participants.. Each congregation of the ELCA may have one unit; however, there may be as many groups within the unit as desired. For example, there may be study groups, Bible study circles, fellowship groups, activity groups, and so forth.


Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America
